




Lumber Yard Checklist




Lumber Yard Checklist

If this is your first visit ever, your first visit in a long time, or you want to get a jumpstart on an outdoor building project, this checklist will help make your lumber yard trip smooth.

Hillinish	Bring Your Measurements Measuring helps determine the amount of materials you'll need and the best way to create a structure that fits comfortably. All you need to start is a simple two-dimensional calculation of the space you intend to build in. A task easily accomplished with a measuring tape, a pencil and a piece of paper. Once you have your measurement multiply length times width (or height) and that will give you your rough square footage.
