




Backyard Hack, Tips to Optimize Small Yards & Outdoor Spaces




Bring Life to Your Outdoors with Greenery

Whether you own or rent, you can install your own floral or edible garden and bring natural elements into your space. If you live on the ground floor, you can install your garden box directly onto the dirt. Or, build a finished-bottom box to store on concrete or a balcony.

Purchase attractive, easy-to-assemble redwood garden boxes to provide the perfect place for plants. To make your gardening easy, elevate your garden to waist level by adding a leg kit, which raises the box off the ground by 30 inches. Add another dimension to your garden box by planting rows of region-appropriate vegetables, herbs, or flowers – or take it a step further by installing redwood or cedar lattice panels on the back of your garden box and planting climbing vines.






Make a Visual Impact with Modular Panels




Increase Usable Space with Ground-Level Decks

Decks are usually associated with large yards, but even if you don't have a lot of space to work with, you can still install a fantastic looking deck that will be inviting to walk on. In fact, you may be at an advantage because many on-ground decks don't require permitting from the city – although it's always a good idea to check city regulations before you begin to build.

You can cover unsightly concrete or an empty dirt patch with an attractive platform that warms up the look of the space. We carry MOSO Bamboo decking, which is a fantastic option for on-ground decks because bamboo allows you to build a deck on the ground without worry of damage or rot. Traditional lumber or composite materials also look great but require some ventilation between the deck and the ground.






Define Your Space and Create Privacy with a Horizontal Fence



Vary Functionality with Movable Seating



Premium Materials Are Worth the Investment


