




Patio cover vs Pergola: What's the Difference?




4 Reasons Homeowners Install Patio Covers

Improves aesthetics



Adds privacy and functionality



Wood options



Tiered covers

Tiered patio covers are a made up of a combination of taller and slightly shorter beams. For instance, a tiered construction may consist of 10 ft. beams for the outside and middle with an 8-foot beam clearance, creating a striking presence.





Gable or a-frames

A gable, or pitched A-frame design maximizes the space and presents a light and airy ambiance. Meanwhile, the addition of the Simpson® black ornamental hardware, called Outdoor Accents, further elevates the look by giving it a modern, stately appearance.

Custom cuts

You can also customize the rafter and beam end cuts to match your design aesthetic. For homeowners who want a modern patio cover design, a minimalistic cut may work best to flow with your home design or a Spanish-style look, a scallop or corbel cut may be more in your style. It's all in the details to create a custom-looking pergola.

Aluminum structures

These are often the go-to patio cover option because there is a range of styles and colors to choose from to match your styel. The California is a solid roof providing complete sun coverage, while a design like the Phoenix Lattice invites in more sun and air flow. Additionally, you can customize the rafters, posts, and lattice spacing, all of which change the whole look and feel of your patio cover.















Decorative screen panels

Not all patios are fully situated in the sun and may need less shade than other homes. A popular idea is to use decorative screen panels and/or screen cloths to block sunlight from streaming in from the side. These can cool down the area, while also adding a decorative touch to your backyard setup. To spruce up the look even further, consider adding Wild Hog panels with a bar top or a pre-made garden box. Then, plant ivy to climb up the patio cover to create additional shade and the ambiance of a private retreat.

Infinity canopies


Décor and accessories
